## THE THEORIES OF THE INSPIRATION OF SCRIPTURE

## **TEXT:** 2 Timothy 3:15,16

- I. NATURALISTIC THEORY: The belief that the Bible is NOT INSPIRED BY GOD AT ALL.
  It is simply a collection of a mythological history of the world...a semi-accurate history of Israel and some wise sayings. (The view held by most "scientists & "intellectuals".")
- **II. NEO-ORTHODOX THEORY:** The view that <u>GOD DIDN'T INSPIRE THE BIBLE AT ALL</u> but He uses it for His purposes, just as He may use the Koran or Book of Mormon, etc. (The view held by modernistic churches.)
- III. THE PARTIAL INSPIRATION THEORY: The belief that ONLY THOSE PORTIONS OF SCRIPTURE CONCERNING DIVINE REVELATION ARE INSPIRED OF GOD. They reject anything concerning science, history and geography (like Israel's right to the Land, etc.)
- IV. THE CONCEPT INSPIRATION THEORY: That the BIBLE CONTAINS GOD'S IDEAS BUT NOT HIS EXACT WORDS. They use the "dynamic equivalence" method of translating the Bible (as in the new "versions" of the Bible)
- V. THE MECHANICAL DICTATION THEORY: LIKE A SECRETARY WRITING A LETTER.

  God spoke the words He wanted written.
- VI. THE VERBAL, PLENARY INSPIRATION THEORY: THAT GOD CHOSE EVERY WORD USED IN THE WRITING OF THE BIBLE. He used the vocabulary and personality of each writer, but did not dictate them. (My view and I hope yours as well.) P.F.
